### ***GENERAL INFORMATION***

#### **1. LOCATION:**

Rinebeck Aerodrome  
9 Morton Rd  
Rhinebeck, NY 12572  
(See directions attached)

#### **2. WHEN:**

October 1 to 3, 2010  
Check-in begins at 3:00 PM on Friday, October 1, 2010  
Departure will be by 11:00 AM on Sunday, October 3, 2010

#### **3. THEME:**

“100 Years of Scouting”

**4. PROGRAM:** Various programs and displays will be available for all members of the scouting program from Tigers to Venturing. Also you will find various displays for your viewing pleasure as well as hands on.

#### **5. FEES:**

Scouts and Leaders in Uniform : 5.00 youth/10.00 adults

Family:

Under 5 – free

6-12 – 5.00

13-17 & 65+ - 15.00

18-64 – 20.00

#### **6. CHECK-IN:**

On Friday night, October 1, 2010, Troops/Crews will enter the campgrounds from Norton Road. Units will be allowed to have one designated vehicle enter and all others will park in the main parking lot.

Packs are welcome to arrive Saturday morning and spend the day and participate in the Saturday evening Campfire.

### **9. ARRIVAL AT CAMP:**

We ask that you arrive together as a Unit (Troop or Crew). While the *Guide to Safe Scouting* prohibits caravanning, there is no reason your unit cannot form up as you arrive at the entrance. Late arrivals or stragglers make it that much more difficult to allocate the appropriate camping space for each unit.

### **10. BOY SCOUT TROOP CAMPSITES:**

The Camporee site will be divided into Troop Campsites. *There will be no vehicles allowed to park in the campsites. Each unit will be allowed one vehicle to pull its trailer to the unit's respective site.* Troop/Crew trailers may **not** be left in your campsite, Units must unload and then move trailers to the parking area. We ask for each unit's cooperation with this to help us maximize our camping space! Campsite sizes will be allocated based on the pre-registered numbers you submit. It is the Unit Leader's responsibility to ensure the accuracy of these numbers.

### **11. CUB SCOUTS:**

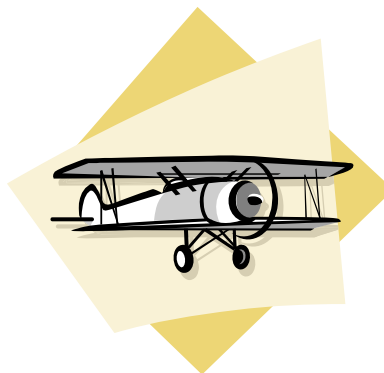
Cub Scouts are welcome to participate on Saturday. The whole family is able to attend, but you must still register as a Pack. Cub Scout Packs will arrive on Saturday morning starting at 9:30am.

### **12. PARKING:**

All parking will be in the main parking lot in the designated area. Anyone with mobility issues should contact the Camporee Director, Mike Harrison upon arrival.

### **13. TOUR PERMITS: (Out of Council Units ONLY)**

Every unit attending must have an approved Local Tour Permit filed at the Council Office prior to arrival. In addition, the unit leader should have a copy of the APPROVED Tour Permit in his/her possession when the unit arrives at camp.

### **14. ANNUAL HEALTH AND MEDICAL RECORDS:**

Units must ensure that all participants (adults and youth) are medically able to participate in this event. Units should bring a copy of each participant's health and medical record. If any participant is updating his/her health form (e.g., when getting a new physical), he or she should use the new form which is required to be updated every 12 calendar months.

### **15. LEADERSHIP:**

Two-deep leadership is required for each unit. *NO EXCEPTIONS!*

### **16. BEHAVIOR:**

As with any Scouting activity, a participant's behavior will be in accordance with the Scout Oath, the Scout Law, and the Golden Rule.

### **17. UNIFORM:**

The class "A" uniform appropriate to one's program (Venturing, Boy Scout, Cub Scout) will be worn during the Camporee special events. Scout activity uniforms (Scout-themed T-shirts) are appropriate during community service period.

### **18. FIRST AID:**

Units should handle all minor First Aid needs of their Scouts. There will be a Camporee Medical Station centrally located for emergencies.

### **19. EMERGENCY PHONE:**

A phone number has been established for *emergencies only*. Messages will be taken to the Sub-Camp Chairperson and forwarded to the unit. Please make sure callers know to give the unit number, contact person, and a detailed message when they call. The number is 845-514-5441. This number is for *EMERGENCIES ONLY!* Please understand that it may take some time to locate the message recipient.

### **20. LATRINES:**

We will use port-a-lets at the Camporee. Cub Scouts and Visitors will use the Areodrome Facilities. There will be no digging of latrines.

### **21. TRASH:**

All trash is to be properly bagged and hauled out by the unit. Bring your own garbage bags. We ask that you remind your Scouts to use good judgment. Please, **PACK IT OUT!!!**

### **22. SANITATION:**

Dishes are to be washed in campsites only. No dishes are to be cleaned at water spigots. Gray water is to be properly disposed of.

### **23. ENVIRONMENTAL:**

No digging of any kind will be allowed in the camping areas. Gateways must be free standing. Guy ropes and small stakes are acceptable. *No ground fires of any kind will be allowed! Fires must be contained in raised containers.*

### **24. INTERFAITH WORSHIP SERVICE:**

A Scout is Reverent. All Scouts and leaders are encouraged to participate in our Interfaith Worship Service on Sunday morning. Please wear your full Scout field uniform.

### **25. DISPLAYS:**

There will be a number of static displays for everyone's enjoyment. Some of these may include military planes, historical re-enactors, bi-planes, and other exhibits.

### **26. TROOP AND PACK CAMPFIRE(Saturday Evening):**

Come expecting a fun experience. Scouts and Cubs will have the opportunity to show off their skills and talents thru various songs, skits and cheers

# Directions

The Old Rhinebeck Aerodrome is located in historic Rhinebeck, New York and can easily be reached by car using the Taconic State Parkway or the New York State Thruway. Picnic and parking facilities are free.

**From the North, South, West:** New York State Thruway Exit 19 to Rt. 209 North. Follow signs to Kingston-Rhinecliff Bridge. Cross over the Hudson River. Right turn at the second traffic light onto Route 9G South. Next traffic light, turn left onto Route 9 North for 1/2 mile. Right onto Stone Church Road for 1-1/2 miles. Left on Norton Road.

**From the East:** Mass. Pike or I-84 to Taconic State Parkway. Exit at Rt. 199 Rhinebeck/Red Hook. Rt. 199 west for 6.8 miles. Left onto Orlich Road, then an almost immediate right onto Norton Road for 1-1/2 miles.
